These young guys showed up and emptied our forty foot shipping container filled with household goods and ministry equipment, carrying the stuff into the house and the downstairs apartment - In $4 \frac{1}{2}$ hours.

They worked like you wouldn't believe! When we treated them to dinner afterwards, we found that they also eat like you wouldn't believe. Thanks so much for your missions giving this month!



We are embarking on an initiative that could have worldwide impact. I wouldn't call it "Reinventing Sunday School," but more like,

"SUNDAY SCHOOL BORN AGAIN."

When I met with the National Sunday School Director of Fiji he shared with me of the disinterest and decline of Sunday School in Fiji. During our time of prayer and fasting in January I took this to the Lord, and between what I read in Becky Fischer's "Redefining Children's Ministry in the 21st Century," and what the Holy Spirit was speaking to me personally, I perceived that as an evangelistic endeavor, Sunday School was a great success; however, as a discipleship tool for children it's failing because it has strayed from the Biblical model of discipling children.

According to *Psalm* 78 parents have to be directly involved in discipleship, or it's not Biblical.

So, we are working on a new model of Sunday School that:

- Puts a parent into the Sunday School class of one of their children once a month to assist the teacher. And...
- 2) Incorporates a Monday night family devotional that is linked to the teaching of Sunday morning. It's easy to use, interactive, and doesn't take a lot of time. Some kids never see their mom or dad open the Bible at home, or lead in worship or prayer at home, unless it's time to eat.

Regardless of public or Christian School attendance, statistics show in homes where the parent is not directly involved with discipleship, only 1 out of every 4 children stay involved in the church after growing up.

This has to change, we're wanting to start here, and we know that prayer is essential for any endeavor that impacts eternal destiny.

So please pray for power, love, and a sound mind to surround us & this initiative!
